### Clark's Pond and Red Brook

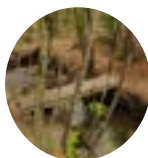
**Driving Distance:** 16 Minutes

**Bug Light Park:** Bug Light Park, the eastern terminus of the Greenbelt Walkway, offers expansive views of Portland Harbor and the skyline of Maine's largest city. The 8.78 acre park was the site of major ship-building activity during WWII.

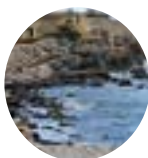
**Time to Walk To:** 10 Minutes

**South Branch Trails:** This wooded trail network is at the heart of the South Portland mall and shopping district and connects, via wooded trails along a brook, the Maine Mall area with Clark's Pond Plaza.

**Entrance:** Start at the pocket park on the east side of Philbrook Avenue/Maine Mall Parking lot where the trail leaves from a gate a little further south.

**Address:** JC Penney Parking lot between mall and TJ Maxx stores, along curved roadway.

**Fort Williams:** Fort Williams Park—90 acres of rugged beauty on Casco Bay—is owned and operated by the Town of Cape Elizabeth. Here you can visit the iconic Portland Head Light and Museum, relish awe-inspiring ocean views, wander diverse natural environments, play on recreational sites, and discover ruins from a long maritime and military history.

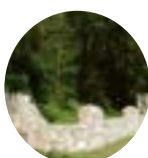

**Riverton Trolley Park:** This lovely riverfront trail sits on fascinating and historic ruins. In the late nineteenth century, Riverton Trolley Park welcomed throngs of people from the city who paid five cents to take the trolley from Portland. The park featured an outdoor amphitheater, croquet court, boat rides, a trout pond, a "casino" building by John Calvin Stevens, and scenic pathways.
